

**PRESBYTERY OF THE PACIFIC

The Urban Church Redevelopment Fund (UCRF) is for congregations of the Presbytery of the Pacific who are seeking to enhance Christ’s mission through new and innovative approaches to urban congregational development.

**History**

The UCRF was established in 1980 by the Presbytery of the Pacific for “the development or redevelopment of a Presbyterian presence in locations within the boundaries of the Presbytery.” Having sought the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit, the Presbytery of the Pacific (the Presbytery) created the UCRF out of the legacy derived from the dissolution of the congregation and the sale of the property of the former South Hollywood Presbyterian Church, which prophetically sums up the lesson that transformation, change and openness to diversity are essential to the Church’s mission in the urban environment. The UCRF is administered through the Congregational Life Committee of the Presbytery.

**Purpose**

The purpose of the UCRF is to implement new approaches to congregational ministry and mission in the Presbytery. The Presbytery celebrates the opportunity to be in partnership with congregations of the Presbytery by providing grants for the short-term support of urban congregations, especially those which exist in older residential communities that are undergoing racial, ethnic, and/or socioeconomic transition. The Presbytery of the Pacific seeks to encourage congregations in their imaginations of new possibilities and, therefore, UCRF exists to fund projects that are not ordinarily funded through the regular Presbytery Mission Budget. UCRF does not fund projects that address capital needs.

**The UCRF Grants Program**

The Congregational Life Committee of the Presbytery may provide up to \$20,000 for the support of congregational programs that are designed to redevelop or revitalize congregations at the committee’s discretion. Ordinarily UCRF grants do not support salaries. However, the UCRF will support new program development in which salaries may be a part, as in cases where the congregation is expanding its ministry and in need of additional staff to support the project. A funded project may apply for continuation funding, but funding for a project will not exceed three (3) years and in diminishing amounts each year.

When greater requests are made than funds are available, congregations in communities that are undergoing racial, ethnic, and/or social-economic transitions will be preferred.

Applications are accepted throughout the calendar year

**Eligibility Requirements**

Projects seeking funding from the UCRF shall be committed to fulfilling the AAEEEO policies of the Presbytery, if employing personnel, and committed to an annual self-evaluation with review by the Congregational Life Committee.

No project is too small for a grant request. Any Presbyterian (U.S.A.) congregation within the bounds of the Presbytery is eligible to apply each year for a UCRF grant.

**Application Procedures**

Congregations apply for a UCRF grant by submitting an application that provides a statement of need and goals of the perceived project and the idea for a plan of action. This also includes basic financial information, realistic time line for funding, ordinarily not to exceed three (3) years.
